HISTORY OF BRANELL



In 2003, 80 acres of both bush and farm land was purchased by Troy and Kathy Brady. At the time, there was only a small run down cottage where Branell Homestead now stands today. Jacaranda trees lined the driveway and there were over a hundred mango trees scattered around the property. Unfortunately, the quaint cottage that was built early last century, was condemned due to extensive termite damage.

Troy and Kathy were disappointed that the original cottage could not be salvaged and they decided to rebuild a house that was similar to it. They completed an owner builder course and spent five years creating a Queenslander with the same pitched roof and old fashioned features as the original Homestead.

Originally when Troy and Kathy were building the Homestead, they did not plan to use it for bed and breakfast accommodation. However, in March 2008 when construction of the Homestead was completed, Troy and Kathy decided to live in the Western Wing and use the Eastern Wing for bed and breakfast accommodation. Just a few months after opening, the bed and breakfast was so busy that there was demand for extra accommodation, so Troy and Kathy built a separate managers residence, 400 meters away from the Homestead at the top of their property and opened up the Western Wing for additional guest accommodation. The entire Homestead became available for the exclusive use of the bed and breakfast guests. In 2010, due to popular demand, construction began on a wedding venue and function centre down at the Jetty.

In 2014 three new Luxury Cabins for extra accommodation were constructed at the top of the property.
